When Jesus appeared to the apostles, he needed to assure the apostles that he is alive and real.

Jesus Lives and Jesus is real. And the Risen Lord Jesus is not a ghost. He is the Son of God, who became man, who died for us, but then rose from the dead. When the disciples saw Jesus, they did not see a ghost. To be sure, they realized Jesus is alive and is real and that those who came after them realized Jesus is real. We have today's Gospel reading and Jesus is real. Jesus said, "Look at my hands and my feet. It is me. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." He then went on to eat something right in front of them.

Many people who lived at the time of the Lord had given up on having any sort of spiritual life. The devil had defeated them. Many people who live in our time have given up on life. They can't see a reason for living. They can't see anything positive in life. The devil is defeating them. But today's time is no longer the devil's world. **Today's time is Jesus' world. People today need to know that there is truth, and there is beauty and there is meaning in life.** People today need to know that Jesus is present for them and us also, not as a ghost, but as the real Risen Lord wanting to share His Life with us and them. That is why the message of the Lord is called the Gospel. The word Gospel means Good News. People today need to know the Good News about the Lord: life is beautiful when lived with the Lord.

How can people come to know this, to know the Good News? It is through us, as we share about Jesus Christ in our lives. Today's reading concludes with Jesus telling the disciples and us, "You are witnesses," witnesses of the Lord's wonders and love and beauty and reality.

Much of the world suffers from unrealistic ideas that come from the devil. Many people have given up on reality and seek spiritual fables and even occult powers to free them from their disillusionment with life. Of course, they are just digging a deeper hole of frustration for themselves. These people need something. They need Someone, They need Jesus. **They need us to bring Jesus to them. We are Catholic. We are called to be witnesses to the Gospel. We are called to proclaim to the world the Good News: Jesus is real!** For us today we are called to be witnesses to Jesus real love, and to give witness to the Gospel of Jesus with our lives, our presence, and our actions and sometimes we may, even need to use words. Amen, God loves you.

**St. Louis Mary
de Montfort**
Feast Day:
April 28th

Louis was born January 31, 1673 in Montfort, France. Since his childhood he was devoted to prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. He joined a society of young men who ministered to the poor and to the incurables in the hospital. He would read to them books while they would eat their meals. At 19 he headed on foot to Paris to study theology. During his journey he gave away all his money and exchanged clothing with the poor. He vowed to exist only on alms received. At 27 he was ordained a priest and at 32 he found his true vocation of preaching.

His preaching attracted thousands of people back to the faith. Father Louis would frequently recommend daily Holy Communion and imitation of the Virgin Mary's acceptance of God's will. St. Louis personal motto was "Totus tuus" (completely yours) as his life was inseparable from his journey to promote genuine devotion to Mary, our Blessed Virgin Mother. Pope John Paul II chose this motto as his Episcopal motto.

St. Louis founded the Missionaries of the Company of Mary (for priests and brothers) and the Daughters of Wisdom. The Sisters of this order cared especially for the sick.

He wrote the book, True Devotion to the Blessed Virgin, which has become a classic in the explanation of Marian devotion. A quote from his book "Mary is the fruitful Virgin, and in all the souls in which she comes to dwell she causes to flourish purity of heart and body, rightness of intention and abundance of good works. Do not imagine that Mary, the most fruitful of creatures who gave birth to a God, remains barren in a faithful soul. It will be she who makes the soul live incessantly for Jesus Christ, and will make Jesus live in the soul."

St. Louis Mary de Montfort died in 1716 in Saint-Laurent-sur-Sevre. A basilica was built there in his honor. He was canonized a Saint in 1947.

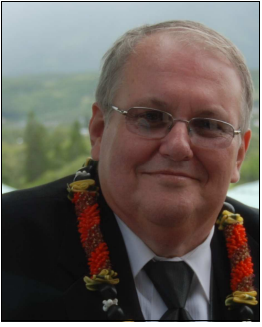

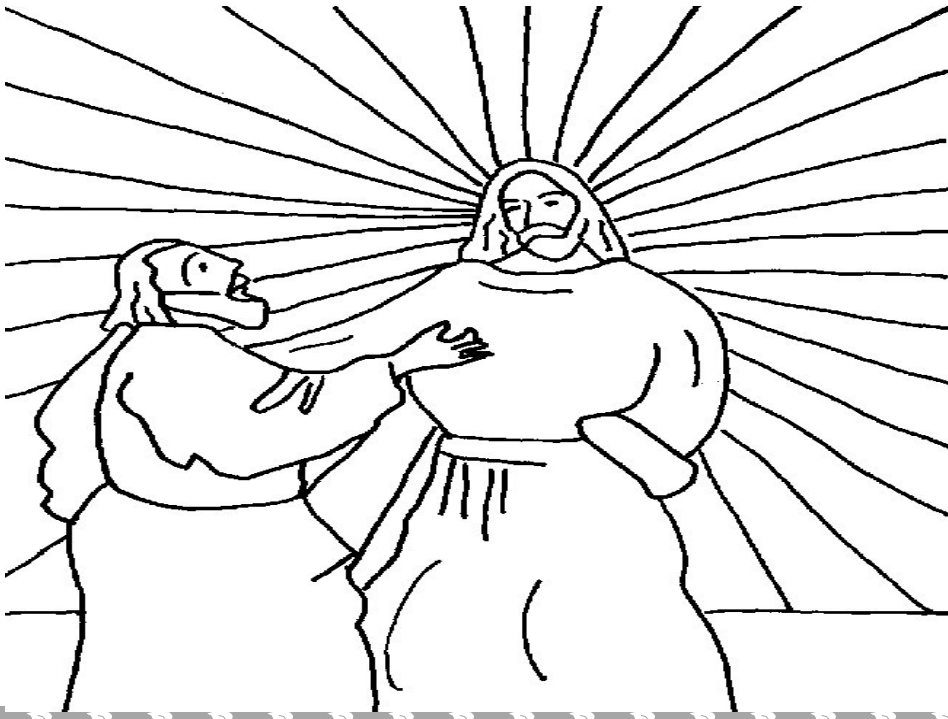

Talking to Your Child about Personal Safety

As a parent or other caregiver there are things you can do to help keep your child safe from sexual abuse. Children as young as 3 or 4 years old can be taught basic messages and rules about personal safety – keeping their private parts safe.

✓ **Before talking to your child** about personal safety, prepare by reviewing the Key Messages below. Decide how and what you'd like to cover.

✓ **Set time aside to talk to your child** or look for ways to weave the conversation into everyday activities— bath time, changing clothes, doctor visits, during rides in the car, etc.

✓ **Be matter of fact and calm** as you speak with your child. A serious, fearful tone may scare your child or convey to him or her that there is something bad or wrong about their private parts.

✓ **You can refer to genitals as "private parts"** (the parts covered by a swim suit) or better yet use the accurate terms. Using the correct terms conveys to your child that you are comfortable talking about their body and personal safety and it gives your child the vocabulary to use should they need to report abuse.

✓ **Use "What if" scenario to ensure your child understands** what to do should they experience unsafe touching (refer to "Key Messages" below). For example say, "What if your babysitter touched your private parts and asked you to keep it a secret, what would you do?"

✓ **Talk about this topic more than once.** Revisit it periodically, adjusting the language and approach to be more age appropriate as your child gets older.
